

Statutory Plan Evaluation Report Leduc County Municipal Development Plan

The new Leduc County Municipal Development Plan recognizes both the Metropolitan Area and the Rural Area policy tiers.

### Introduction

The Province has adopted the Regional Evaluation Framework (REF) for the Edmonton Metropolitan Region Board's review of statutory plans. Leduc County has referred its proposed Municipal Development Plan (MDP) to the Edmonton Metropolitan Region Board (EMRB) pursuant to REF Section 4.1.

## **Purpose**

The purpose of proposed Bylaw 08-19 is to replace the current MDP with a more contemporary document that is consistent with the Edmonton Metropolitan Region Growth Plan (EMRGP) and recent changes to municipal boundaries. The Plan policies recognize that the County comprises two distinct areas including:

- the Nisku Area which is located within the Metropolitan Area of the EMRGP; and,
- the Rural County which corresponds to the remainder of the County lying within the Rural Area tier as per the EMRGP.

The Plan proposes goals, principles, and form and character of development for each of the two areas. While the policies affecting the Nisku Area support compact, urban and mixed use development, policies affecting the Rural County are intended to maintain its rural character and conserve agricultural land. The proposed MDP recognizes the population and employment projections of the EMRGP. It also includes policies regarding Natural Resources, the Natural Environment, Open Spaces Recreation and Tourism, Infrastructure, and Collaboration.

The Plan is informed by earlier plans and studies including:

- Agriculture Strategy (2016);
- Economic Development and Growth Management Strategy (2016);
- Aerotropolis Viability Study (2016); and
- Environmentally Significant Areas Study (2015).

Creation of the proposed MDP involved a robust communication and consultation process that combined stakeholder and public feedback to improve the quality of the Plan.

The proposed Leduc County MDP policies are consistent with the EMRGP.

### Conclusion

That the EMRB APPROVE the proposed Leduc County Municipal Development Plan.

## Summary

The current MDP was adopted in 1999. The County is much changed since then with the growth of the Nisku industrial complex, urbanization adjacent to the north County boundary and annexations to Edmonton, Beaumont, Leduc, Devon and Calmar resulting in a reduced land base. The paradox between encouraging greater urbanization/industrialization and protecting traditional agricultural practices is

recognized and resolved in this policy document.

The proposed MDP is focussed around eight goal statements: Protect Agricultural Land and Support Diversity in Agriculture; Promote Economic Development; Develop Complete Communities; Promote Responsible Use of Natural Resources; Protect and Enhance the Natural Environment; Identify and Act on Opportunities for Recreation and Tourism; Develop Efficient Infrastructure; and Collaborate with Adjacent Municipalities and Regional Partners. A ninth goal is to implement the policies of the Plan.

The Nisku Area corresponds closely to the portion of Leduc County that lies within the Metropolitan Area of the EMRGP. Major components of the area include the Nisku industrial complex, East Vista residential community and the Edmonton International Airport. Concentrated growth of


the industrial complex is envisioned along with the planned development of compact urban and country residential lands. An Urban Centre is proposed within this area.

Residential development within the Urban Centre will provide for a sustainable community with a diversity of land uses that meet the everyday living, working, shopping, and recreational needs of County residents

The expansive Rural County is subdivided into five subareas as shown on the map below. The five subareas are:

- Country Residential;
- Lakeshore Community;
- Local Employment;
- Hamlet Mixed Use; and,
- Genesee Power Plant Area.

The primary principle proposed for the Rural County supports the protection and enhancement of the existing rural landscape by allowing only development that is compatible with the rural environment.



New Sarepta is identified as a Growth Hamlet due to its ability to provide municipal levels of piped water and wastewater servicing. It has been identified for higher density and more mixed use growth at a higher rate than may have occurred in the past.

### **Evaluation Criteria**

When evaluating a statutory plan or statutory plan amendment, the Edmonton Metropolitan Region Board must consider whether approval and full implementation of the statutory plan or statutory plan amendment would result in development that is consistent with the Edmonton Metropolitan Region Growth Plan.
