DEMOGRAPHICS

Leduc County's

population has increased close to 10% since the 2021 federal Census.

The average age is 42 years, with roughly 41% of the population being 15 years and older.

Just over 18% of the population is 65 years and older.

Visible minorities account for roughly 5% of the municipality's population. The Indigenous population accounts for 6% and the immigrant population is 8%.



SETTING IDEAS

Growth and diversification of investment is crucial to the future success of Leduc County.

The County aims to foster an environment that promotes innovation, job creation, new investment and growing the local economy.

The County is ideally positioned in the middle of Western Canada on major transportation corridors running north-south and east-west, making it a natural hub for transportation and warehousing. A vehicle that leaves Leduc County can access all major cities in Western Canada in 24 hours or less.

Turning Challenges into Opportunities



The County is experiencing growth pressures as it relates to:

- → Accelerating development in the -County's urban growth area.
- \rightarrow Rural depopulation.
- \rightarrow Conservation of prime agricultural land in proximity to growth areas.
- \rightarrow Growth and development at Edmonton International Airport (YEG).
- \rightarrow Redevelopment in Nisku.
- \rightarrow Growth in the warehousing/logistics sector.

CURRENT CHALLENGES / INVESTMENT NEEDS:

- \rightarrow Infrastructure expansion to accommodate redevelopment.

- $\rightarrow~$ Broadband infrastructure and capacity.
- \rightarrow Preparation for emerging technologies (drones, autonomous technologies).

GREATEST RISKS FACING LEDUC COUNTY:

- \rightarrow The ability for YEG to attract new flights is a risk for the entire region.
- \rightarrow Encroachment of non-agricultural development into prime agricultural lands.
