



## PROGRESS TO DATE

- The Board approved a Project Charter outlining the proposed scope of work and deliverables for the Regional Broadband initiative, and subsequently contracted RSM Canada and TaylorWarwick Consulting to provide technical and project management expertise to the initiative.
- Through the project consultants, EMRB facilitated **eighteen** workshops with municipalities across the Edmonton Metropolitan Region, as well as **seven** interviews with provincial, federal and regional stakeholders, to assess the current state of broadband in the Region.
- In June 2020, the Board received the **Broadband Current State Analysis** for information. The report provided an overview of the current state of broadband in the Region, municipal service levels, and emerging recommendations. Specifically, the Current State Analysis:
  - Reviewed relevant broadband program and strategy documentation
  - Aggregated workshop and interview feedback
  - Assessed over 240 regional service levels
  - Compiled an inventory of assets and infrastructure
- A **Socio-Economic Impact Assessment** has been completed analyzing potential return on investment to communities and regional GDP related to improving broadband connectivity.
- EMRB hosted two webinars providing member municipalities, public, and regional stakeholders with an update on the initiative, insights on the current state of connectivity in the Region, and highlights of the potential regional socio-economic return on investment from investing in broadband. ### WHAT IS THE REGIONAL BROADBAND SITUATION ANALYSIS?

As a priority of the Board, the Regional Broadband initiative will examine the state of broadband connectivity in the Region and create a compelling regional case for improving broadband service.

The initiative will result in a Situation Analysis report which will identify critical service gaps, opportunities to improve economic competitiveness in the Region, and make the case for improved connectivity through an impact analysis outlining the socio-economic benefits for the Region.

### WHY A REGIONAL BROADBAND SITUATION ANALYSIS?

The Edmonton Metropolitan Region Growth Plan and 2018-2023 Strategic Plan outlined the conditions needed for a competitive and sustainable Region. Connectivity continues to be a barrier to the growth, economic competitiveness, and sustainability of many municipalities in the Region.

Many communities in the Region lack sufficient connection speeds needed for everyday life in an increasingly digital economy. Improving digital infrastructure is a regional challenge that needs a regional solution. Municipalities have traditionally approached broadband network development independently and on an ad-hoc basis.

A regional approach to advocating for improved broadband infrastructure will help us connect and ensure the Region moves at the speed of life.

### WHAT'S AT STAKE WITH REGIONAL BROADBAND?

Simply put, connected communities and competitive businesses. From work and school, to health and entertainment, our lives are increasingly data dependent. Internet connectivity is no longer a luxury; it is a necessary utility for regional growth. Connectivity ensures families can stay connected to their community and services, students can learn, and businesses can take part in the digital economy.

Access to reliable high-speed internet is about accessing opportunity to grow and learn, and is vital for a globally competitive, attractive modern economy and a high quality of life for residents of the Region.
